
CAMP OF A REGIMENT OF INFANTRY



Each company has its tents in two files, facing on a street perpendicular to the color-line. The width of the street depends on the front of the camp, but should not be less than five paces. The interval between the ranks of tents is two paces; between the files of tents of adjacent companies, two paces; between regiments, twenty-two paces.^{1,2}

The length of the direct step, or pace, in common time, will be twenty-eight inches, reckoning from heel to heel, and in swiftness, at the rate of ninety in a minute.³
